UC/CSU GPA CALCULATION

- The GPA UCs and CSUs use for admission looks **only**:
 - At courses in **A-G subject areas**
 - At grades received from **summer before 10th grade through summer after 11th grade**.
- A-G Courses count toward the A-G requirements, even if not used for GPA. For example, A-G courses taken in 9th grade count toward the A-G requirements, but not be part of a UC or CSU GPA.

WHAT IS “FAFSA”?

- The FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (“FAFSA”).
- When you submit the FAFSA, you’re applying for money to help pay for college, including:
 - Federal & State Grants (free money that you don’t have to pay back)
 - Government Student Loans (money you borrow at low and/or subsidized interest rates)
 - Work-Study Programs (part-time jobs on campus that help you earn money)
 - Scholarships (some scholarships require students to file a FAFSA to qualify for consideration)
- There was a Zoom presentation for all **seniors** in High School about FAFSA, and all seniors should have already created their **FAFSA ID**. There will be a parent Zoom about FAFSA later this month.
- The FAFSA opened on **October 1st**. You should apply as early as possible, because some aid is first-come, first-serve.
- All** seniors planning to attend college should file the FAFSA. You may qualify for more than you think, and some scholarships and schools require you to file the FAFSA.



WHAT IS “TEST BLIND”?

- When CSU and UC Schools say they are “test blind,” they mean that they do NOT consider SAT, ACT, or AP scores as part of their review process at all.
- Students can still submit scores, which can be helpful for course placement after admission.
- Note that “test blind” may mean other things at different schools. For example, some schools may consider tests that are submitted, even though they do not require them to be submitted.
- In addition, test blind policies are frequently changing at many universities, so it is good to check for updates to policies for future application years.

*Typically November 30th. There is a special deadline for Class of 2026 because November 30, 2025 falls on a Sunday. System glitches can happen, so students are encouraged to submit applications on the earlier side (prior to November 1st, if possible).
