


SOCES/LAUSD GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

SOCES High School students must meet 3 different sets of requirements to graduate:

(1) A-G REQUIREMENTS

- A-G courses are **required** by most California 4 year universities **AND** for high school graduation.
- A grade of **D or better** is required for each course to meet the requirement for **high school** graduation, but a **C or better** is required for the course to count for **UC and CSU admission**.
- These are **minimum requirements**. Additional years of certain courses are recommended to help a student's chances of admission to the competitive universities.
- Only the Math and Language other than English requirements may be met with classes taken in 7th or 8th grade. All other subject requirements must be completed during 9th-12th grade.
- **Community college courses** (taken concurrently or over summer) may meet these requirements, but students should confirm with their counselors before signing up for the course.
- High School students will meet with their academic counselors at least 1-2 times a year to track progress and discuss options for meeting all requirements.



(2) CALIFORNIA STATE (CDE) REQUIREMENTS

- The California Department of Education ("CDE") sets additional requirements that apply to all California High Schools
- Many of the CDE requirements overlap with the A-G requirements.
- However, California adds **2 additional requirements**:

Government and Economics 1 year

Physical Education 2 years

ACCESSING IGPs THROUGH THE PARENT PORTAL

HOW TO FIND YOUR STUDENT'S INDIVIDUALIZED GRADUATION PLAN ("IGP")

1. Log into [LAUSD's Parent Portal](#) through your Parent Login.
2. Click "View Student Details" on your student's profile.
3. Click on the "Student Menu" (for mobile users, it will just say "Menu").
4. Click on "College & Career".
5. Look for the "Individualized Graduation Plan" section, and "Click "Download Plan." (If it won't load on your phone, try it from a computer; the mobile site often has technical difficulties).
6. When the report is ready, click "View Plan." You will get a PDF with the status of your child's progress toward LAUSD graduation requirements.

You also can print the "Progress to Graduation Report" in the same section as the IGP, which has a helpful summary in the bottom right corner of all graduation requirements.

WHERE TO FIND RELEVANT INFORMATION IN YOUR STUDENT'S IGP

- The first 5 columns in the IGP Report track courses taken:
 - The 1st column lets you know the **Graduation Requirement**. It details what is required.
 - The 2nd column lists the **Courses Completed** by the student in that category.
 - The 3rd column lets you know what **Courses In Progress** will meet that category.
 - The 4th column tells you the **Remaining Required Courses** the student has left in that category.
 - The 5th column lists 4 categories, and lets you know if each one is met (with a "Y" for "yes," an "N" for "no" and a " - " for "not applicable"):
 - **CDE:** These are the California requirements from the California Board of Education.
 - **LAUSD A-G:** These are the A-G required courses (with a D or better)
 - **CSU:** These are the A-G courses required for CSU admission (with a C or better)
 - **UC:** These are the A-G courses required for UC admission (with a C or better)
- Finally in the 6th and final column, you will find several helpful sections:
 - In the **Current Credits** section, you will find the total amount of credits your student has earned
 - The **Other Requirements** section will let you know if your child has completed the Service Learning and Career Pathway requirements (Y indicates "Yes" and N indicates "No").
 - The **Current Schedule** section will show you the current courses along with current grades.
 - The **College Enrollment** section will show you the college courses the child is taking.
 - The **Grade Point Average (GPA)** Section will show you different types of GPAs for your student, including LAUSD weighted (W) and unweighted (UNW) GPAs. These may also include CSU and UC GPAs after a student has taken courses that count toward those GPAs (e.g., starting summer before 10th grade). There are many ways to calculate GPA!
